



Introduction to the mobile apps

In this video you will learn about the FarmIQ mobile apps, where you can get them, what they do and how they work.

There are two FarmIQ apps.

The original FarmIQ app is called **FarmIQ Classic**, and we've released a new app, that has new and enhanced features with more to come. It's simply called **FarmIQ**.

You can use the apps together, and switch between them depending on what you need to know, or what you need to record, when you're out on the farm.

If you don't already have the apps on your phone, you'll need to download them, from the Apple app store or Google play store.

The first time you open each app, you'll need to log in. Just use your FarmIQ login details.




In the FarmIQ app, you can see the map and show layers like features and hazards...







... and paddock information. What information you can record depends on your pack.



And, depending on your pack, in **Stock** you can record animal activities as they happen.








We're adding more recording options as we improve the app. What you see will depend on your FarmIQ pack.

You can record activities, like deaths, by describing the animals or by choosing from your saved Favourite stock descriptions.




Tap More to:


- switch between farms you have access to
- check your changes are updating to the FarmIQ system in the Activity log
- log out, or
- switch straight to FarmIQ Classic.







In the Classic app, tap the menu icon at the top left to explore the features.



Depending on your pack, you can record events activities like stock births or sales...









... and health and safety incidents – or see farm visitors.

Tap **Go to the new FarmIQ app** to switch back.

Keep an eye out for updates, as we work to make the new FarmIQ app do more and more of what you need.

Eventually, it'll take over from FarmIQ classic, which will be retired.
